
Potential Boundary Changes to Balance Enrollment – Northwest Grand Junction Appleton / Pomona / Tope Virtual Parent Meeting

Process

- The Board of Education has requested that stakeholders consider relatively small, phased school boundary changes in a few areas
- Elementary Principals and faculty have been involved in feasibility and data awareness
- Virtual parent meetings and a survey will help guide Board decision
- School Board will consider stakeholder input and make a decision in January
- No decisions have been made
- Pandemic is impacting enrollment
 - (Down 3% State-wide)



Potential Elementary Changes

- Appleton ES is growing rapidly and will exceed its capacity over the next six years
- A new school will eventually be constructed north of I-70 to address new housing growth
- The Appleton attendance area includes areas south of I-70 that will eventually be exclusively assigned to Pomona
- Space exists in the three area schools to accommodate growth over the next 6 years if minor boundary changes are made




Potential Elementary Boundary Changes

Move 69 Students From Appleton to Pomona ES


Move 56 Students From Pomona to Tope ES

Future Northwest Grand Junction Elementary Boundaries







Shift Areas Descriptions

- Appleton to Pomona
 - The area bounded on the north by G Rd.,
 - On the west by Business 70 / U.S. 50 and
 - On the east by 25 Rd.
- Pomona to Tope
 - The area bounded on the north by I-70
 - On the west by 26 Rd.,
 - On the east by 27 Rd. and
 - On the south by G Rd.

Gradual Change

- Phased change starting with next year's kindergarteners, new move-in's and families electing to change
- Gradual five-year transition
- Transportation provided to the extent possible
- Eventually the 100+ Pomona students north of I-70 will transition to Appleton or a new school and the 100+ Appleton students south of I-70 will transition to Pomona creating a natural boundary at I-70
- School-of-choice and transfer options will vary schoolto-school
